PREPARING FOR ADMISSION
An undergraduate GPA of 3.00 or higher for the last two years of undergraduate work.
Two letters of recommendation.
A completed admissions application to the <u>Graduate School</u> . (A complete graduate application includes, a completed application, payment an application fee, official transcripts, career goals statement, and letters of recommendation).
Please note the program only accepts 15 hours of credit as a Student at Large. After 15 hours of credit, you must be admitted to LBSI program
NOTE: Although no longer required for admission to the professional courses it is strongly recommended that you successfully complete the Illinois State Licensure Testing System , Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), before enter or early in your program. You can find information and a study guide for this test on the <u>ILTS Website</u> . This score will be needed prior to student teaching.
If you completed the ACT+writing or SAT you may substitute the scores in for the TAP. If you choose this option must submit the scores to the State as soon as possible but prior to student teaching (the deadline for the listing of the scores on the State website will be published by the department). If you choose this option it is your responsibility to verify the scores are listed in your ELIS account. More Information.
Please provide a copy of the passing score to the graduate secretary in the Department of Special and Early Education (SEED) for your licensure file.
BEGINNING YOUR LBSI GRADUATE PROGRAM
Accept your admission using My NIU. My NIU Job Aids are available online. If you have additional problems you can contact the ITS Help desk by calling 815-753-8100. Meet with your program adviser to plan your program of study. You should also discuss any transfer credits from other universities. Please have a copy of the syllabus from the course(s) in question. The syllabus will be used to determine if the appropriate course standards have been met. If you do not meet with your program advisor during your first semester after admission an advising hold is placed on your account and you cannot register for classes.

Meet with your **faculty mentor** to discuss life experience and how you may substitute it for SESE

 Review all sections of the program including the course checklist and requirements for student teaching.

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Please note that for candidates with limited experience in special education or an undergraduate degree in an unrelated field, deficiency and prerequisite courses may not be used toward the minimum 36 credit hours needed for the master's degree.

***Eligibility for Paid Student Teaching

Illinois State Law permits some teacher education candidates to remain in teaching positions and continue to be paid by their school districts during student teaching. The Illinois Administrative Code 25.620 states that an individual may receive credit for student teaching or pre-student teaching clinical experiences that are completed during the time for which the individual is paid as a teacher.

To determine if you are eligible to be paid while student teaching, please contact your faculty mentor for the Policy for Eligibility to be paid while Student Teaching and who must approve your eligibility.

Second Student Teaching Placement

Candidates who have completed one paid student teaching placement may complete a second paid student teaching placement in their school district or a summer school teaching placement if they meet the prerequisites listed below.

Eligibility a second student teaching placement:

- a. A second paid student teaching placement or summer school student teaching will **only** an option for candidates who have completed a paid student teaching placement.
- b. A second paid student teaching placement or summer school student teaching is only available for the second area of student teaching not covered by their paid student teaching placement.

Permission to complete the second paid student teaching or summer school student teaching must be obtained from the candidate's faculty mentor. If you feel that you qualify for summer school student teaching, talk to your faculty mentor who will describe additional requirements related to placement, assignments, grading, and supervision of summer school student teaching or the second paid student teaching assignment.

PREPARING and APPLYING FOR STUDENT TEACHING

Applications must be received **one year in advance** of your expected student teaching. Candidates already teaching in a school must adhere to this deadline. Be sure that you have been **admitted to the graduate school** and tracked your courses so that you can apply on time!!

Prior to applying for student teaching, you must be admitted to the LBSI program and to the graduate school.

 Application for student teaching (1 year prior to the semester you expect to take your clinical/student teaching experience. Plan accordingly!!) The exact due date for the paper work will be announced by the Clinical Office. It is your responsibility to check with the Clinical office to identify application materials and deadline dates.

 The <u>NIU Safety Tutorial</u> . A paper copy of your 'confirmation of successful completion' must be provided to the Clinical office.
 Mandated Reporter. If you already completed a workshop or course, please provide a copy of the completed tutorial or course to the graduate secretary , 162 Gabel Hall, Department of Special and
